

Portland Port is a commercial port, therefore, for health and safety, passengers and visitors are not permitted to walk freely within the port estate.


Under the international agreement and UK legislation, anyone entering a Restricted Area are liable to a search: refusal will result in being denied access.

### **CAR PARK**

All visitors should park in the visitor car park and use the port's complimentary shuttle service to the Cruise Terminal for check-in.

The visitor car park is located on the right-hand side after driving through the security barriers.

Visitors will be issued a vehicle pass from the security gatehouse which must be displayed clearly on the dashboard throughout the visit.





# SHUTTLES BUS PICK UP POINT

From the car park, use the pedestrian crossing to the bus stop shelter (labelled "Bus Stop To Cruise Terminal" on the above map).

Please wait inside the bus shelter, as a shuttle bus will stop to collect any waiting visitors.

Shuttle bus frequency is 15 - 30 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.

### SECURITY CHECKS

The shuttle bus will stop at the entrance to the Cruise Terminal, and visitors should disembark to proceed into the Cruise Terminal.

In the terminal, photographic identification will be checked against the security list. A picture will be taken and will be used to issue a restricted area pass.

Whilst in the restricted area, all passes must be worn on the outside of all clothing, at chest height.

### **QUAYSIDE**

When crossing the quayside, please be mindful of any moving vehicles and follow any instructions given by a member of port staff.



## RETURNING TO THE VISITOR CAR PARK

When leaving the cruise ship all visitors must use the shuttle bus service to return to their vehicles.

Please ask the shuttle bus driver to pull over at the bus stop on the exit road opposite the visitor car park (pictured above).

When boarding the bus, please hand all restricted area passes to the driver.

The shuttle bus will stop on the port's exit road, where a pedestrian crossing leads to the car park.
